

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Lambathas house is a l_2 story Cape built in the Federal style. The center entry has a 4 panelled door topped by a transom light and flanked by pilasters which rise to meet a partial entablature. All of the windows have two over one sash and are framed by shutters except for two, one over one windows in each gable. The medium pitched roof is topped by a massive central chimney and the eaves treatment consists of close raking eaves and molded lateral eaves with a wide frieze. The house rests on a granite slab foundation. On the north elevation is a 1 story shed roofed shed with clapboard siding and a cement foundation.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: To the northeast of the house is a separate $1\frac{1}{2}$ story gable roofed shed/garage with clapboard siding, six over six windows framed by shutters, a recent garage door and a cement foundation.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: 1 Acre. Bounded to the N. by McAskill and Bake, S. by Scotland Road, E. by Gursky, W. by Greenwood.
