ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Goulet house is a $l_{\mathbb{Z}}^{\perp}$ story, vernacular Queen Anne style structure characterized by numerous projections and the use of decorative shingles. The center entry has a multipanelled victorian door with several lights which is sheltered by a l story, jerkinheadroofed, enclosed porch with decorative wood shingles. All of the windows have two over two sash and are framed by projecting caps and shutters. The medium-pitched roof is topped by a tall, narrow chimney and the eaves treatment consists of a boxed cornice with gable end returns. Two, l bay, gable roofed, pedimented, wall dormers have been set into the roof on the front facade. Decorative wood shingles have been applied to the upper third of the front facade. The structure rests on a brick foundation. On the east elevation is a l story, shed roofed, open porch which leads to a l story gable roofed wing with a pedimented gable. The $l_{\mathbb{Z}}^{\perp}$ story gable roofed ell has clapboard siding with the same decorative wood shingles applied to the upper third of the wall surface. It has two over two windows and rests on a brick foundation. A l story shedroofed ell leads to a third, l story ell with a gable roof, two over two windows and a 4 panelled door. Both of these ells rest on brick foundations.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: To the northeast of the house is a l_2 story, jerkinheadroofed barn with two over two windows, a vertical board door, and a brick foundation. Above its entrance is a gable roofed wall dormer with decorative wood shingles.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: .7 Acres. Bounded to the N. by Bake, S. by Bartlett St., E. by Diamondon, W. by Brewster.
