

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION: The Hogue house is a 2½ story, gable roofed Greek Revival style house characterized by gable front orientation to the street. The sidehall entry, located on the east elevation has a 4 panelled door flanked by full length sidelights and sheltered by a 1 story, hip roofed, enclosed porch. All of the windows have six over six sash capped with pedimented lintels. The medium pitch roof is topped by a narrow corbel capped chimney and the eaves treatment consists of close raking eaves with slight gable end returns, and a boxed cornice along the lateral eaves. The house rests on a granite slab foundation. The 1 story, gable roofed ell has clapboard siding and a tall narrow corbel capped chimney. It has six over six windows with pedimented lintels and nine over six windows framed by architrave trim. The entrance has a 4 panelled door with two lights sheltered by a shed roofed doorhood. To the north of the ell is an attached 1 story, gable roofed shed with a 1 story garage on its east elevation.
