ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Radigan house is a 1½-story, Greek Revival, Three-Quarter house with Victorian era remodeling. The offset entry has a 5-panelled (Victorian) door with one large light surmounted by a pediment motif. All of the windows have two-over-one sash with pedimented lintels. The medium-pitched roof is topped by a narrow, corbel-capped chimney. The house rests on a granite slab foundation.

A 1/2-story, gable-roofed ell projects to the northeast. On its east elevation is a 1-story, shed-roofed wing. To the rear of the ell and wing is a 1-story shed.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: To the east of the house is an attached 1-story, gable-roofed shed which leads to a 1½-story, gable-roofed barn.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: .3 acres bounded to the N-Sloan, S-North Danville Road, E-Spear, W-Hatch, Sloan.
