ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Gallagher house is a $l\frac{1}{2}$ story, gable roofed late nineteenth century structure with Greek Revival characteristics evident in the gable front orientation to the street and sidehall entry. Some Italianate influence is also seen in the three light door which is sheltered by a doorhood supported by heavy Italianate brackets with ornamental drop pendants. Most of the windows have two over one sash framed by shutters. Some fixed single pane windows are located on the west elevation. The medium pitch roof is topped by a tall, narrow, corbel-capped chimney and the house rests on a brick foundation. On the east elevation is a 1 story, shed roofed enclosed porch. The 1 story, gabled roofed ell has clapboard siding, recent doors and windows, a tall narrow corbel capped chimney and rests on a concrete block foundation.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: To the southwest of the house is a separate, l_2^{1} story garage with a saltbox roof.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: 1.5 Acres. Bounded to the N. by North Danville Rd. S. by Gallagher, E. by Bernaby Avenue, W. by Blood.
