

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Wing house is a $2\frac{1}{2}$ story, late nineteenth century vernacular structure. The sidehall entry has a 3 panelled (victorian era) door with two arched lights sheltered by a flatroofed, slightly projecting doorhood. All of the windows have two over two sash framed by architrave trim. The medium pitched roof is topped by a narrow, corbel-capped chimney and the eaves treatment consists of a boxed cornice with gable end returns. Vinyl siding has been applied to the house. The structure rests on a brick foundation. On the northwest elevation is a 2 story wing. Three ells project to the southwest.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: A 1 story garage is located to the southwest of the house. To the south of the house is a separate 1 story, enclosed porch. A separate 1 story shed is located to the southwest.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: 11 Acres. Bounded to the N. by Philbrick, S. by Dietz and Haney, E. by Marshall Rd., and O'Neil, W. by French.
