

The Russman house is a  $l_2^{\frac{1}{2}}$  story, gable roofed early twentieth century structure built in the Bungalow style. Its major feature, located on the front facade, is a 1 story shedroofed open porch which is surmounted by a 2 bay, hip-roofed dormer. The steeply-pitched gable roof is topped by a narrow, corbel capped chimney and features exposed rafters in the lateral eaves and bracketed raking eaves.

All of the windows have six over one sash. The house rests on a stone and brick foundation

An attached 1 story, gable roofed shed projects to the south of the house.

## RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT:

A separate 1 story garage is located to the south of the main block. Also to the south is a  $l^{\frac{1}{2}}$  story, gable roofed barn.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: 19 Acres. Bounded to the N. by Exeter Road, Eastman, and Russman, S. by Russman, E. by Eastman, W. by Exeter Road.

Historic Associations: Three genrations of Smiths lived in house; one was town road agent. Original house burned in 1918, was rebuilt in 1920.
