

ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Philpott house is a $1\frac{1}{2}$ story Greek Revival style structure with its five bay, gable end oriented toward the street. The 4 panelled center entry door is flanked by sidelights and panelled pilasters which rise to meet a full pedimented entablature. Window sash includes two over two, six over two and four over four, all with arched caps. There is one multi-light bow window on the northeast elevation. The medium pitched roof is topped by one corbel capped chimney, and two four bay shed dormers. The eaves treatment consists of a boxed cornice with a wide frieze, and gable end returns visually supported by panelled pilasters.

A 1 story gable roofed ell rests on a cement foundation. It has a 4 panelled door sheltered by an overhanging shed roofed porch, clapboard siding, and windows with six over

six sash.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: Attached is a $l_2^{\frac{1}{2}}$ story gabled roof barn has wood shingle siding, swinging type vertical board doors and an extended shed roofed open shed.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: 9.5 Acres. Bounded to the N. by Verrill, Quintel, Regen, and Teppen, S. by Goodwin, E. by Exeter Road, W. by Kerkhoff.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Evaluation & Historical Associations):

The C. H. DeRochemont House is one of four wide gable Greek Revival houses built on the Exeter Road c.1840. The other three are Sites #159 and 162, with the last on the Exeter portion of the road. This interesting architectural configuration was not widely used and is interesting to find in concentration in this area.
