ADDITIONAL ARCHITECTURAL AND STRUCTURAL DESCRIPTION:

The Wajda house is a $2\frac{1}{2}$ story, late vernacular structure in the Georgian style which was modified in the Greek Revival period. The center entry has a recent 4 panelled door framed by full length sidelights (Greek Revival) and wide pilasters which rise to a full entablature. All of the windows have six over six (Greek Revival) or one over one sash and some have projecting caps. The médium pitched roof has a large central chimney with a corbelled cap and the eaves treatment consists of a boxed cornice with a narrow frieze and gable end returns (all greek revival characteristics). The house rests on a granite slab foundation. A 2 story, gable roofed ell projects to the south. It has clapboard siding, a recent door, is topped by a narrow corbel capped chimney and rests on granite slabs. A 1 story shed projects from its south elevation.

RELATED STRUCTURES AND CONTEXT: To the southwest is a $l_{\overline{z}}^{\pm}$ story, gable roofed barn. To the southeast is a $l_{\overline{z}}^{\pm}$ story garage with four sheds projecting from its south elevation.

BOUNDARY AND ACREAGE DESCRIPTION: 6 Acres. Bounded to the N. by Exeter Road, S. by Bradbrook, E. by Bradbrook, W. by Masse.
